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

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#### FROM THE DESK OF THE PRESIDENT

The Oakwood Manor Board of Directors held

its meeting on November 19 and approved the 2025 budget as well as the Hurricane Repair Policy. That policy includes a repair timeline: house damage sustained from the 2024 hurricane season must be repaired by December 31, 2025. If repairs are not completed by that date, the homeowner must provide a fully executed contract to the Association and request an extension from Management. This policy generated a lot of discussion, some of which related to homes that were damaged by Hurricane Ian in 2022. The 2022 Hurricane Repair Policy was similar to the 2025 policy and stated that repairs must be completed by December 31, 2023, or the homeowner needed to provide a fully executed contract to the Association and request an extension from Management. Out of more than 30 homes that were damaged by Hurricane lan, there are only three homes that have not been repaired. The circumstances for each home is unique and Bill Walsh, our Park Manager, is in communication with the appropriate homeowners.

Approximately 75%, roughly 485 homes, had some level of damage from Hurricane Milton. As you have likely noticed, homes had varying degrees of damage, and many are in the process of being repaired. However, not all debris has been removed, and 16 homeowners have received letters to let them know that their property needs to be cleared of debris.

Another part of the Board meeting discussion had to do with the process regarding homeowners who are not in compliance with Oakwood Manor's Rules and Regulations. Examples mentioned were yard maintenance, where to park cars, and the use of the pool and hot tub. Unfortunately, for some homeowners, a verbal reminder that they are not complying with the Rules and Regulations is insufficient. If it is a parking violation, for example, the Management will call the homeowner or place a note on the windshield reminding the homeowner where cars are allowed to be parked.

Below is the process that Oakwood Manor uses for unsightly weeds and other violations.

- First Notice: a letter is mailed to the homeowner that states the violation and cites the specific Rules and Regulations related to the violation. The homeowner is given 30 days to correct or submit a written plan that includes the schedule to comply.
- Second Notice of Violation: a letter is mailed to the homeowner reiterating the violation and citing the specific Rules and Regulations related to the violation. The homeowner is given 15 days to correct or submit a written plan that includes the schedule to comply.
- Final Notice of Violation: a letter is mailed to the homeowner that reiterates the Second Notice of Violation. If the homeowner does not comply within 15 days, the Association will have the necessary violation corrected and will bill the homeowner for all expenses incurred.

According to the Florida State Statutes that regulate homeowner cooperatives like ours, the Board of Directors can vote to approve fining a homeowner or suspending a homeowner's right to use any of the Association's property for noncompliance of the Rules and Regulations. The homeowner can appeal to the Hearing Committee whose task is limited to determining whether to confirm or reject the fine or suspension levied by the Board. The

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duties of the Hearing Committee are outlined in the *Rules and Regulations* under the section: **The Hearing Committee and Fines**.

Below, you will find the section of Florida State Statute 719.303 that pertains to fines:

- (3) The Association may levy reasonable fines for failure of the unit owner or the unit's occupant, licensee, or invitee to comply with any provision of the Cooperative Documents or reasonable Rules of the Association. A fine may not become a lien against a Unit. A fine may be levied by the Board on the basis of each day of a continuing violation, with a single notice and opportunity for hearing before a committee as provided in paragraph (b). However, the fine may not exceed \$100 per violation, or \$1,000 in the aggregate.
- (a) An Association may suspend, for a reasonable period of time, the right of a Unit Owner, or a Unit Owner's tenant, Guest, or invitee, to use the Common Areas, common facilities, or any other Association property for failure to comply with any provision of the Cooperative Documents or reasonable Rules of the Association. This paragraph does not apply to limited common elements intended to be used only by that Unit, Common Areas needed to access the Unit, utility services provided to the Unit, parking spaces, or elevators.
- (b) A fine or suspension levied by the Board or administration may not be imposed unless the Board first provides at least 14 days' written notice to the Unit Owner and, if applicable, any Occupant, licensee, or invitee of the Unit Owner sought to be fined or suspended and an opportunity for a hearing before a committee of at least three members appointed by the Board who are not officers, directors, or employees of the Association, or the spouse, parent, child, brother, or sister of an officer, director, or employee. The role of the committee is limited to determining whether to confirm or reject the fine or suspension levied by the Board. If the committee does not approve the proposed fine or suspension by majority vote, the fine or suspen-

sion may not be imposed. If the proposed fine or suspension is approved by the committee, the fine payment is due 5 days after the date of the committee meeting at which the fine is approved. The Association must provide written notice of such fine or suspension by mail or hand delivery to the Unit Owner and, if applicable, to any tenant, licensee, or invitee of the Unit Owner.

I hope this gives you a better understanding of the processes in place when there are violations and further steps are necessary.

Our community does not have behavior monitors or police to enforce our *Rules and Regulations*. We must rely on the personal integrity and cooperation of each resident. When a neighbor or Management asks you to comply with our rules, please honor that request. The smooth functioning of our community depends on cooperation, which is everyone's responsibility.

There will be three Board openings as of January 13, 2025. The Board encourages anyone who is interested in serving in this capacity to fill out the form, Notice of Intent to Be a Candidate for the Board of Directors of Oakwood Manor Homeowner's Association of Sarasota, FL. Inc. The form is due in the office no later than Wednesday, December 4, 4pm. There is also a Candidate Information Statement to complete if candidates want to provide members with personal background, prior Association experience and comments about their Board candidacy. That form is due in the office no later than Monday, December 9, 4pm. A Meet the Candidates' Night has been scheduled for Friday, January 3, 2025, at 7pm, and all members are encouraged to attend.. The Annual Membership Meeting is scheduled for Monday, January 13, 2025, at 7pm. You will receive more information about that in the coming month.

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
#### **NEW RESIDENTS**

# TREASURER'S REPORT October 31. 2024

Thanks to Milton we had a net operating loss for the month of \$25,416. The major reason was the expense of tree removal and trimming which was \$56,000.

Year to date operating income of \$1,078,014 less operating expenses of \$1,018,454 leaves us with an operating profit for the first ten months of \$59,560. We can look forward to another large expense in November for tree trimming and clean up caused by Milton.

Our month end cash balances were operating \$117,762 and our replacement funds \$503,240. Additions to fixed asserts for the month was \$64,487 for the maintenance building, all payments for the new building are paid for out of our replacement funds.

I must say that November will be my last official board meeting. I have served on the board and your treasurer for twenty years and have really enjoyed the twenty years.


Here's an update on what's happening in the Park:

#### **MAINTENANCE BUILDING UPDATE:**

All progress is on hold until FPL connects the power to the building. Oakwood Manor is on their schedule and will power us up in the next 4-8 weeks.

#### **ASSOCIATION ISSUES:**

- a. We have almost all the brush and trees cleaned up. The kitchen fan and the A/C units on the clubhouse roof have been repaired. Hurricane cleanup costs will exceed \$100,000 to the Association.
- b. A fence company will be out to measure for an estimate before Christmas.
- c. Three companies have been contacted for a proposal to replace the bocce court roof. I have been told by a City Inspector that a permit will be required.
- d. The phone line to the Visitor Gate kiosk is still not working. Frontier Communications has been out twice so far. The issue seems to be upstream and there is a future work order for December 4<sup>th</sup>.
- e. The replacement mailbox posts have all been delivered and installed where needed.
- f. We have a new pest control company servicing the clubhouse beginning in November. NatureZone will offer residents a reduced rate for treating individual homes. Stop by the office to get further information.


